Latest resources from the History Curriculum Centre

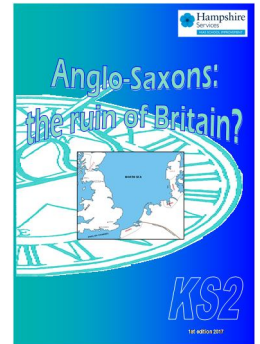
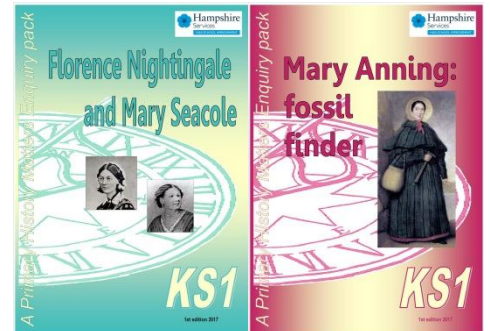
Recent **Key Stage 1** products include enquiries comparing Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole and another looking at the life and work of Mary Anning of Lyme Regis. Studies of all three can also be supported by loan collections available from the centre.

At **Key Stage 2** we recently released a new enquiry entitled: Anglo-Saxons; the ruin of Britain? This enquiry covers Roman withdrawal from Britain in c410 and the fall of the western Roman Empire, Scots invasions from Ireland to north Britain (now Scotland), Anglo-Saxon invasions, settlements and kingdoms: place names and village life, Anglo-Saxon art and culture, and Christian conversion. As well as this, the enquiry looks at the Anglo-Saxon's broader impact on our language and aims to develop children's understanding of **Cause and Consequence**.

Cost for any of these enquiry packs is £22 each for subscribing schools.
