Navigating Narratives: Our history curriculum should be shaped by clear historical narratives. Historical knowledge only makes sense and becomes memorable when understood within the wider historical narrative, meanwhile historians suggest competing historical narratives. So how do we teach the historical narrative and how diverse is the narrative we teach? The narratives we choose to teach and whose history we represent is a considerable ethical and moral responsibility with obvious resonance for the present. Ofsted have made it clear that they will consider the stories that are told in our history curriculum. The KS3 national curriculum requires history students to be able to explain and analyse change and continuity across time periods and study themes. GCSE students are also asked to write historical narratives/accounts. It is therefore essential that we consider carefully how we enable students to understand, challenge and write historical narratives, which is the focus of this years' History Network.
